Examine Yourselves

There is a story told in two of the gospels about an encounter that Jesus had with a young man. In Matthew 19:16-22 and in Luke 18:18-30 we are told this story from two viewpoints, both inspired by the Holy Spirit. You can read both stories for yourselves, but the important verses for this article are Matthew 19:22 (KJV) "But when the young man heard that saying, he went away sorrowful: for he had great possessions." and Luke 18:23 (KJV) "And when he heard this, he was very sorrowful: for he was very rich." You will notice that in both stories, the young man left Jesus when he was told Luke 18:22 (KJV) "Now when Jesus heard these things, he said unto him, Yet lackest thou one thing: sell all that thou hast, and distribute unto the poor, and thou shalt have treasure in heaven: and come, follow me. "

The young man had something that he loved more than Jesus and that was riches. Jesus understood what would keep this man from being a disciple and He told him that that thing had to be eliminated from his life if he were to be a follower. And both Matthew and Luke say that the young man "went away sorrowful" because he was very rich.

It is important that we examine ourselves to identify those things that keep us from being a true disciple of Jesus. We are told in Matthew 18:7-9 (KJV) that we should take drastic action to eliminate the things that prevent us from fully committing to Jesus. Listen to what Jesus says "Woe unto the world because of offences! for it must needs be that offences come; but woe to that man by whom the offence cometh! Wherefore if thy hand or thy foot offend thee, cut them off, and cast them from thee: it is better for thee to enter into life halt or maimed, rather than having two hands or two feet to be cast into everlasting fire. And if thine eye offend thee, pluck it out, and cast it from thee: it is better for thee to enter into life with one eye, rather than having two eyes to be cast into hell fire." As we examine ourselves, and we find something that is taking us away from being a true follower of Jesus, we need to remove it from our lives. If it is Television that prevents us from studying, it needs to be removed. If it is a job that consistently prevents us from worshiping with the saints, we need to consider changing jobs. If it is sports, or hobbies, or clubs and other activities they need to be dealt with and removed from our lives or changed so that they do not interfere with worshiping our God and studying His word.


The most dangerous enemy that we Christians face is not our friends that consistently try to get us to party with them, or jobs that sometimes keep us from worshiping, or hobbies and other activities that sometimes steal our study time. No the worst enemy that we face is our selves. John hinted at this when he wrote John 10:27-30 (KJV) "My sheep hear my voice, and I know them, and they follow me: And I give unto them eternal life; and they shall never perish, neither shall any man pluck them out of my hand. My Father, which gave them me, is greater than all; and no man is able to pluck them out of my Father's hand. I and my Father are one." Here Jesus is saying no person is able to force us to sin and leave the church. No one can take us by force out of the saving

hand of God. But we are also told by Peter in 2 Peter 2:19-22 (KJV) that "While they promise them liberty, they themselves are the servants of corruption: for of whom a man is overcome, of the same is he brought in bondage. For if after they have escaped the pollutions of the world through the knowledge of the Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ, they are again entangled therein, and overcome, the latter end is worse with them than the beginning. For it had been better for them not to have known the way of righteousness, than, after they have known it, to turn from the holy commandment delivered unto them. But it is happened unto them according to the true proverb, The dog is turned to his own vomit again; and the sow that was washed to her wallowing in the mire." Peter is addressing Christians here (2) Peter 1:1 makes this clear) and he is telling them that if they had escaped the pollutions of the world and then become entangled with them again, their end is worse than the beginning. And Jesus tells us Himself that a person who begins a life of discipleship and then turns back to look at all the things they gave up is not fit for the kingdom Luke 9:62 (KJV) "And Jesus said unto him, No man, having put his hand to the plough, and looking back, is fit for the kingdom of God"

It is critical that we understand that our worst enemy can be ourselves. And because of this we need to have the attitude that Paul had **1 Corinthians**9:26-27 (KJV) "I therefore so run, not as uncertainly; so fight I, not as one that beateth the air: But I keep under my body, and bring it into subjection: lest that by any means, when I have preached to others, I myself should be a castaway." Paul made sure that he examined himself, "But I keep under my body, and bring it into subjection..." because he did not want to be thrown away when he meets Jesus on judgement day. But how do we keep our

bodies in subjection? The only way to do this is to keep focused on the goal. And that goal is a home with Jesus in Heaven. We must examine our selves to make sure that we are not looking longingly back at the life we left when we became Christians. We must examine our



selves to see if there are things in our lives that prevent us from being a truly dedicated disciple. No one can force me to leave the saving hand of God, but I can chose to leave. The only way we can prevent ourselves from turning back to the world and leaving the hand of God is to constantly examine ourselves. Have you done this lately? If not, do it today!
