What Now?

Have you ever been on a roller coaster? The way they climb, drop and turn make them extremely fun for some while for others they are completely unenjoyable. Now while roller coasters have their place one thing we as the church must realize is our spiritual walk is to not be that way. Life will absolutely have ups and downs but these are circumstances. For example listen to Paul II Corinthians 11:24-27 NKJV

"From the Jews five times I received forty stripes minus one. Three times I was beaten with rods; once I was stoned; three times I was shipwrecked; a night and a day I have been in the deep; in journeys often, in perils of waters, in perils of robbers, in perils of my own countrymen, in perils of the Gentiles, in perils in the city, in perils in the wilderness, in perils in the sea, in perils among false brethren; in weariness and toil, in sleeplessness often, in hunger and thirst, in fastings often, in cold and nakedness—"

Now certainly I have never been apart of these extremely difficult circumstances but just reading what Paul said could you say what he would say in other scriptures? II Corinthians 11:28 NKJV "besides the other things, what comes upon me daily: my deep concern for all the churches." Or what about what Paul says in Philippians 4:10-12 NKJV "But I rejoiced in the Lord greatly that now at last your care for me has flourished again; though you surely did care, but you lacked opportunity. Not that I speak in regard to need, for I have learned in whatever state I am, to be content: I know how to be abased, and I know how to abound. Everywhere and in all things I have learned both to be full and to be hungry, both to abound and to suffer need." Life is going to have it's ups and downs. Life will be hard, frustrating and sometimes seem impossible. But that must never change what our goal is. That goal is to spread the gospel. We must not allow the ebbs and flows of life dictate our love for God.

Read carefully the words of James as he points out what happens when our spiritual walk becomes like that of a roller coaster. James 1:6-8 NKJV "But let him ask in faith, with no doubting, for he who doubts is like a wave of the sea driven and tossed by the wind. For let not that man suppose that he will receive anything from the Lord; he is a double-minded man, unstable in all his ways." "With no doubting for who doubts is like a wave of the sea." The turbulence in the life filled with doubt is unbearable because there is no hope. But we have hope and that hope is a living one I Peter 1:3-5 NKJV "Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who according to His abundant mercy has begotten us again to a living hope through the resurrection of Jesus Christ from the dead, to an inheritance incorruptible and undefiled and that does not fade away, reserved in heaven for you, who are kept by the power of God through faith for salvation ready to be revealed in the last time." Are we confident in God. I mean the One who has never left, nor forsaken us? Who has been and who is the I am! The One who moved us by obedience to His word from the power of darkness into His kingdom. If we truly are confident the question I have is, NOW what?

Though now you do not see Him, yet believing, you rejoice with joy inexpressible and full of glory, receiving the end of your faith—the salvation of your souls." To spread the gospel message which is able to save the souls of the willing hearts? Will we not let the ebbs and flows of life directs us away from God but refine us to be found in the eternal glory?
