What is Sin?

The title may seem like a nonsensical question to many of us. After all, there are a number of passages that list what we would consider to be sins. Among these, some tell us that which we **should not** be like, such as 1 Petr 2:1 (KJV 1900) where Peter writes: "Wherefore laying aside all malice, and all guile, and hypocrisies, and envies, and all evil speakings," and 1 Peter 2:11 (KJV 1900) "Dearly beloved, I beseech you as strangers and pilgrims, abstain from fleshly lusts, which war against the soul;". Or 1 Peter 3:9 (KJV 1900) " Not rendering evil for evil, or railing for railing:" and Romans 1:28-32 (KJV 1900) "And even as they did not like to retain God in their knowledge, God gave them over to a reprobate mind, to do those things which are not convenient; Being filled with all unrighteousness, fornication, wickedness, covetousness, maliciousness; full of envy, murder, debate, deceit, malignity; whisperers, Backbiters, haters of God, despiteful, proud, boasters, inventors of evil things, disobedient to parents, Without understanding, covenantbreakers, without natural affection, implacable, unmerciful: Who knowing the judgment of God, that they which commit such things are worthy of death, not only do the same, but have pleasure in them that do them".

The Holy Spirit through the inspired writers also tells us the things that we **should** do. Probably the most well known example of this is the response that Jesus gave the Pharisees when asked what was the greatest commandment: "Jesus said unto him, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbor as thyself. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets". Matthew 22:37–40 (KJV 1900).

Also, His comments on love in what we call the sermon on the mount: "Ye have heard that it hath been said, Thou shalt love thy neighbor, and hate thine enemy. But I say unto you, Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you;" Matthew 5:43–44 (KJV 1900)

Additionally, we find in 2 Peter 1:5–10 (KJV 1900) things that we should strive to be: "And beside this, giving all diligence, add to your faith virtue; and to virtue knowledge; And to knowledge temperance; and to temperance patience; and to patience godliness; And to godliness brotherly kindness; and to brotherly kindness charity. For if these things be in you, and abound, they make you that ye shall neither be barren nor unfruitful in the knowledge of our Lord Jesus Christ. But he that lacketh these things is blind, and cannot see afar off, and hath forgotten that he was purged from his old sins. Wherefore the rather, brethren, give diligence to make your calling and election sure: for if ye do these things, ye shall never fall:"

When we consider the sinful things that we are told not to do with the things we are told to do that result in sin if we do them not, we see certain lifestyles that are sinful. Among these are ungodliness and unrighteousness, including not glorifying God as God (Romans 1:18-21), Creating images of men and animals and worshiping them as God (Romans 1:23), homosexuality (Romans 1:26-27), and cursing (Romans 3:13-14). These can all be categorized as sins of commission, sins of omission, and lifestyle sins.

But one sin that we often do not consider is that listed in the last phrase of the aforementioned **Romans 1:32: "have pleasure in them that do them"**. When we enjoy watching others commit sins, we sin ourselves. This would involve things such as watching pornography or participating in activities such as concerts where the lyrics of the songs are ungodly, filled with cursing and foul language, among a host of other things that we often enjoy that are unrighteous and ungodly. This is a sin that most of us would rather not discuss, because we often find ourselves participants therein.

God has provided a way for us to escape the awful taint of sinful living. 1 John 1:7 (KJV 1900) "But if we walk in the light, as he is in the light, we have fellowship one with another, and the blood of Jesus Christ his Son cleanseth us from all sin." Come, walk in the light by hearing the gospel, believing it, confessing that belief, being baptized, and then living a life worthy of the calling of a Christian, a follower of Christ.
