That You Might Know with Certainty

Sitting at my desk Friday trying to decide what I wanted to write about this week, I opened my Bible software to look up some passages that I might use as the foundation for an article. It opened to Luke chapter I. I had been studying there the last time I had it open. As I began to read, I got to this verse: Luke I:4 (NASB) "so that you may know the exact truth about the things you have been taught." The King James Version translates it slightly different: Luke I:4 (KJV) "That thou mightest know the certainty of those things, wherein thou hast been instructed." Regardless of which version you use, what the Holy Spirit wanted Luke to tell Theophilus (and us) is that what he had written was the truth. To make sure that Theophilus understood, the Holy Spirit inspired Luke to write: "It seemed good to me also, having had perfect understanding of all things from the very first, to write unto thee in order, most excellent Theophilus," Luke I:3 (KJV). Although Luke said this about the letter that he was writing to Theophilus (which became the Gospel of Luke), the other writers could say the same thing because the Holy Ghost was inspiring them as they wrote.

As Luke wrote, the Holy Ghost guided his thoughts and had him put to paper the things that were needed for Theophilus (and us) to know with certainty the exact truth of what had happened. In doing this, the Holy Ghost made sure that not only Theophilus understood, but every generation that followed would understand what was necessary for them to know the truth about Jesus, the Apostles, and the early church. In doing this, the Holy Ghost insured that the truth would be evident and that good men and women would find and follow it throughout the ages. When these good men and women found and followed the truth they didn't become known by Luke's name but by the "new name" which God gave them "... "Christians".

When You Should Be A Teacher

While the entire Bible should be carefully and thoroughly studied, there are three books in the New Testament that are of unique importance. These are I) The Acts of the Apostles, commonly called simply "Acts", 2) The letter of Paul to the Roman's, and 3) Hebrews.

In Hebrews 5:12 (KJV) the writer states "For when for the time ye ought to be teachers, ye have need that one teach you again which be the first principles of the oracles of God; and are become such as have need of milk, and not of strong meat." The inspired writer makes it clear that Christians should, at one time or another be able to teach. The Holy Spirit, inspired the writer to pen this for a purpose because at some point each of us will be faced with a person who asks a question about Christianity. Then another question will need answering, "Are you ready!"

Its apparent from Hebrews 5:12 that the Christians being written to here were not ready. The inspired writer clearly states that although time had put them in a situation where they should be teachers, they needed someone to teach them again. And instead of needing meat they needed someone to go back to the "First Principles" and teach them. In Hebrews 6:1 the inspired writer tells them what the first principles of the doctrine of Christ are, and that they need taught to them again. These are: repentance from dead works, faith toward God, the doctrine of baptisms, the doctrine of laying on of hands, the doctrine of resurrection of the dead, and the doctrine of eternal judgment.

The question that we all need to consider is; "Do you still need milk after living years as a Christian, or are you ready to teach others and bring them to salvation which can only be found in Jesus Christ?".
