Cliques

When several people come together to accomplish a common set of goals, they organize in one of two ways. They can either be a group or a team. An article on the internet states: "A group is a collection of individuals who coordinate their efforts, while a team is a group of people who share a common purpose." When thinking about it, it seems that Jesus caused the disciples to organize as a team rather than a group. He gave a common purpose. Matthew 5:43-45 (KJV) "Ye have heard that it hath been said, Thou shalt love thy neighbour, and hate thine enemy. But I say unto you, Love your enemies, bless them that curse you, do good to them that hate you, and pray for them which despitefully use you, and persecute you." And toward the end of His work on earth, He restated this; Matthew 22:37-40 (KJV) "Jesus said unto him, Thou shalt love the Lord thy God with all thy heart, and with all thy soul, and with all thy mind. This is the first and great commandment. And the second is like unto it, Thou shalt love thy neighbour as thyself. On these two commandments hang all the law and the prophets". And just before He ascended into Heaven, He gave an additional common purpose that compliments the love we are to have for all people. Matthew 28:18-20 (KJV) "And Jesus came and spake unto them, saying, All power is given unto me in heaven and in earth. Go ye therefore, and teach all nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Ghost: Teaching them to observe all things whatsoever I have commanded you: and, lo, I am with you alway, even unto the end of the world. Amen." These common purposes guided the early church and us today. While we often view these teachings of Jesus independently, they are connected. If we love our neighbor, teaching them about the gospel and salvation is something that we cannot avoid doing. These two common purposes make the church a team rather than just a group of people.

Functioning as an efficient team, one that strongly believes in our common purposes and has a strong desire to coordinate efforts to meet them, we will see amazing results. Sometimes, members of the team begin to work in smaller groups whose common purposes do not match those of the team. These are cliques. Cliques form when some people in the team share characteristics that others in the team may not. It could be that they are similar in age, family situations, race, color, gender or maybe even in abilities. The Cambridge Dictionary defines a clique as "a small group of people who spend their time together and do not welcome other people into that group."

The impact of cliques on teams is never good. Two examples will provide enough information for us. These can be found in an article on the website LinkedInⁱⁱ and another on the site "verywellmind"ⁱⁱⁱ. Read them at your convenience and see how they impact the team they are a part of.

The early church had to deal with this too. You will recall the attitude of the Pharisees within the church toward the Gentile Christians as recorded in Acts 1:1-5. The Pharisees, in this case, were the classic example of a clique in the church and it was a problem for several years. Even Peter fell to pressure from the Jewish clique in the church^{iv}. The eventual results of cliques in the church is almost always division.

We currently have a good cohesive team that shares the common goals that Jesus gave His disciples. We also have strong, healthy groups of friends, but cliques can and do form in the best of teams, especially as they grow. We need to start now to be sure that cliques do not form within our congregation and ruin the work we are doing.
