The Weight of Snow

Recently while driving with my family observing the large amount of snow that has fallen, I asked Brooklyn a question. My question was, how much does a snowflake weigh. Her response was, “I don’t even know what I would use to measure a snowflake”. Yet, when we look around we can see that while one snowflake may be difficult to weigh a large amount can have a major impact. In fact looking at the trees hunched over shows this to be true. Just think about that for a moment. One little unmeasurable snowflake may seem insignificant but a collective grouping can take down the tallest tree.

I am sure by now you see a parallel coming, that parallel is of a collective group of Christians working together. While one Christian may feel as if the entire world is on their shoulders and can even feel insignificant. A collective group of Christians with the same mind and same goal is unstoppable. The Bible clearly shows that we are to be unified in this way. In this article we will look at a couple passages that bare this truth out.

When thinking of unity it is hard not to read the words of Jesus. Specifically in the garden before the cross. If you knew that a cruel, humiliating and unjust process was about to take place, what would be on your mind? Here is what was on our Lord’s mind. **John 17:20-23 NKJV** “I do not pray for these alone, but also for those who will believe in Me through their word; that they all may be one, as You, Father, are in Me, and I in You; that they also may be one in Us, that the world may believe that You sent Me. And the glory which You gave Me I have given them, that they may be one just as We are one: I in them, and You in Me; that they may be made perfect in one, and that the world may know that You have sent Me, and have loved them as You have loved Me.” You see, Jesus before going to the cross prayed for you and me. Specifically for our unity. How remarkable is that! Instead of thinking we would have to be all alone and by ourselves. Unity for us was prayed, that we might be one through Him. Collectively working together to glorify the Father.



This thought is also brought out through the inspired pen of Peter. **1 Peter 3:8-12 NKJV** “Finally, all of you be of one mind, having compassion for one another; love as brothers, be tenderhearted, be courteous; not returning evil for evil or reviling for reviling, but on the contrary blessing, knowing that you were called to this, that you may inherit a blessing. For “He who would love life And see good days, Let him refrain his tongue from evil, And his lips from speaking deceit. Let him turn away from evil and do good; Let him seek peace and pursue it. For the eyes of the Lord are on the righteous, And His ears are open to their prayers; But the face of the Lord is against those who do evil.” All of us are to be of one mind, meaning unified. How is this unity shown? Through compassion, love, tenderheartedness, courteous and not reviling but blessing. What a beautiful pattern to show what a collective group is to aim for. In aiming for this united front not only will we be able to be a lighthouse in the community but God is glorified!

While in our own eyes one snowflake may be seemingly small, a large amount building upon one another can have a significant impact. Will this be our attitude as the church of Christ that meets in Wasilla? Knowing that the working together with one another we can be have a great impact here. **Acts 17:5-6 NKJV** “But the Jews who were not persuaded, becoming envious, took some of the evil men from the marketplace, and gathering a mob, set all the city in an uproar and attacked the house of Jason, and sought to bring them out to the people. But when they did not find them, they dragged Jason and some brethren to the rulers of the city, crying out, ‘These who have turned the world upside down have come here too.’” No matter what we go through, if we do it with the purpose to serve God the outcome will be for our benefit.
