Just Another Day?

As I look at my calendar, each day has some sort of name attached to it. The specific day may be a holiday, political day, birthday, or any other kind of day that one would like to insert. Now having these moments to remember certain events is not a bad thing but it does cause me some pause. Why, you might ask because it can become very easy to allow our minds to think that Sunday is just like one of those days. What do I mean, I mean we can find ourselves making that which is holy, common.

God has clearly set aside a day for those who would follow His word to worship Him. Acts 20:7 NKJV "Now on the first day of the week, when the disciples came together to break bread, Paul, ready to depart the next day, spoke to them and continued his message until midnight." This shows that Paul stayed with the disciples as they came together to break bread. That is to partake in the Lord's Supper. Another passage which indicates a certain day on which the disciples came together is found in First Corinthians. I Corinthians 16:1-2 NKJV "Now concerning the collection for the saints, as I have given orders to the churches of Galatia, so you must do also: On the first day of the week let each one of you lay something aside, storing up as he may prosper, that there be no collections when I come." Here again we see the first day of the week. Friends this day which is the first day of the week is the day in which God has set aside for true worshipers to remember the sacrifice of His son. It is also the time in where we contribute to the work of the church and listen to the word preached. This is not like every other day in which some worldly connection has been given.

While it is also important for us to recognize that we can think about our Savior, read scripture, pray, and sing any day of the week. The FIRST day is the time in where the people of God assemble to partake of the Lord's Supper. I Corinthians 11:23-26 NKJV "For I received from the Lord that

which I also delivered to you: that the Lord Jesus on the same night in which He was betrayed took bread; and when He had given thanks, He broke it and said, 'Take, eat; this is My body which is broken for you; do this in remembrance of Me.' In the same manner He also took the cup after supper, saying, 'This cup is the new covenant in My blood. This do, as often as you drink it, in remembrance of Me.' For as often as you eat this bread and drink this cup, you proclaim the Lord's death till He comes." How often do we obey this command, as often as we come together. That is each first day of the week.

So, while there are events or days that are special to us, let us never allow those days to gain priority over the first day. The first day of the week is Sunday. We must be diligent to focus our minds on the kingdom. There are so many things that can trap, distract, and cause us to stumble if we are not careful. However, are we thankful to God that He has allowed us a time to be refreshed. Hebrews 10:24-25 NKJV "And let us consider one another in order to stir up love and good works, not forsaking the assembling of ourselves together, as is the manner of some, but exhorting one another, and so much the more as you see the Day approaching." We can, on the first day of the week, stir up love and edify each other. We can encourage and strengthen one another. Most importantly we can glorify our Father by remembering His Son. Are you treating the Lord's Day as another day or have you purposed in your heart to set the Lord's day as a priority.
